

January is the National Health Observance Month for Cervical Cancer and Glaucoma





Cervical cancer is a type of cancer that occurs in the cells of the cervix — the lower part of the uterus that connects to the vagina. Various strains of the human papillomavirus (HPV), a sexually transmitted infection, play a role in causing most cervical cancer.

When exposed to HPV, the body's immune system typically prevents the virus from doing harm. In a small percentage of people, however, the virus survives for years, contributing to the process that causes some cervical cells to become cancer cells.

There are usually no signs or symptoms of early cervical cancer, but it can be detected early with regular check-ups. Check-ups should include tests such as the Pap test and/or the HPV test. The Pap test checks for pre-cancerous changes in the cervix. The HPV test looks for high-risk types of human papillomavirus (HPV) infections, which are more likely to cause pre-cancers and cervical cancer. Regular screening can find dysplasia (pre-cancer) or early cervical cancer when it is easier to treat.

Prevention: The HPV Vaccine prevent infection by certain types of human papillomavirus (HPV). HPV vaccines protect against either two, four, or nine types of HPV. According to the CDC, the ideal age range to receive the HPV vaccine is between 11 and 12 years old. However, adolescents as young as 9 years old and adults up to age 45 may be candidates for the vaccine.

Glaucoma A condition where the eye's optic nerve, which provides information to the brain, is damaged with or without raised intraocular pressure. If untreated, this will cause gradual vision loss.

Very common (More than 3 million cases per year in US)

Treatments can help manage condition, no known cure

Often requires lab test or imaging

Can last several years or be lifelong

Common for ages 50 and older

Family history may increase likelihood

Symptoms may include.

Blurred vision, glare, eye pain, redness in the eyes, headache, and narrowed vision, vision loss.

Treatment: See an Ophthalmologist for your treatment plan

This may include; Medication, Peripheral iridotomy, Surgery; Trabeculectomy

Conventional surgery for glaucoma done to remove the accumulated fluid.



On December 23, 2022 We said our final goodbye to our beloved church mother. Mother Clara B. Jones-Willis.


The celebration of her life by her family and many friends.

I have A Dream!

On August 28, 1963, some 100 years after President Abraham Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation freeing the slaves, a young man named Martin Luther King climbed the marble steps of the Lincoln Memorial in Washington, D.C. to describe his vision of America. More than 200,000 people-black and white-came to listen. They came by plane, by car, by bus, by train, and by foot. They came to Washington to demand equal rights for black people. And the dream that they heard on the steps of the Monument became the dream of a generation.

Martin Luther King Jr., an African-American clergyman and civil rights leader, was fatally shot at the Lorraine Motel in Memphis, Tennessee, on April 4, 1968, at 6:01 p.m. CST. He was rushed to St. Joseph's Hospital, where he died at 7:05p.m.
